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Year 5 Enviro Champions

On Wednesday the 28th of October, we went to Ardlethan Public School for the finale of the Enviro Champions Leadership Program. While we were at Ardlethan we learnt how to make paper and giant bubbles. Each school group that had participated in the program presented the project they had chosen to improve the environment of their school.

Some of the other school projects were: Yenda Public School made a lizard lounge because they had lots of lizards running around their school; Rankin Springs Public School made a watering system for their vegetable garden; and St Joseph's, Narrandera focussed on recycling plastic bottles and paper.

We decided to do something useful with the food scraps from kid's lunches and all of Year 5 helped to make worm towers for the school gardens. We also labelled scrap buckets for each class and would like to have a scrap bin in the playground for more food scraps.







We enjoyed the chance to get together with other schools to see their projects and to learn about what to do to make the environment better at our school and the community.

Last week we again worked as a whole class and went in pairs to present each class with their scrap bucket, told them a bit about worms and showed them what to do to empty the bucket into the worm towers.

Enviro Champions Class Presentations

Last Friday afternoon, we went to KH to teach them about worms. We taught them about what to put in the worm bucket and what not to put in. Afterwards we took them out to their garden and showed them the worm tower we had made and put in the garden. Then we came back in and made worms with pipe cleaners and Cheerios and the kids coloured in a worm as an art activity. After they had finished making the worms they ate the Cheerios. KH liked going out to the garden and seeing the worm towers. Khan and Dayne.

On Friday afternoon we went to K1C to show them their worm buckets and the worm towers that we made in term 3. We also told them what goes in their worm towers and how they need to empty their worm buckets. After we showed them their worm buckets we went back to the classroom to do some fun activities. The activities that they chose were making worms using pipe cleaners and cheerios. Bodean and Zoey I.

On Thursday afternoon we went to 1D to teach them about worms. We had put pictures on the buckets to make it easy for them to see what could be put in it. We all went out to the garden to show them and then we went back to the class room to make Cheerio worms. Aaliyah and Jake.

In terms 3 and 4, Year 5 made worm towers to put in each garden. On Thursday Indiah and I went to 2B and gave them their worm buckets to put their scraps in. Then we went out to the garden to show them how to use the buckets and towers. After they got how to use the worm towers we went inside and we worked on a work sheet together. They just love being out in the garden and we really enjoyed helping them too. Ella Vidler and Indiah Morgan.

On Thursday we went to 3M. We showed them the worm buckets and showed them what worms can and can't eat. After that we showed them the worm towers and how they put their worm's scraps into the towers. After we showed them the worm towers we gave them their work sheets. The next day Year 5 made jelly worms. When they were set we squeezed the worms out of the straw and gave them to 3M to eat.

On Friday afternoon we went to 3J to show them our plan to reduce the amount of food scraps in the bin. We showed them their new worm towers. We started making our worm towers in term 3 and we finished them at the start of term 4. Blake and I showed 3J what the worms can eat like fruit, vegetables and bread and what the worms can't eat like lemon, orange, passionfruit and meat. Reid and Blake.

On Thursday we went to 4C and showed them the worm bucket they will use to feed their food scraps to the garden worms. We told them what goes in the bucket, which will then feed the worms through the worm towers that Year 5 have put into the gardens. We had a 10 minute talk then we handed out a sheet to the kids and helped them if they needed. After a little we went out to the garden to show them where the worm towers are and what they do. We showed 6H how to use their worm bucket and gave them a worksheet to do about worms. We showed 6H their worm tower in their garden bed and showed them how to feed the worms. 6H enjoyed going out to the garden. Stevie and Chelsea.

On Friday morning last week we went to 6C to do our worm bucket/tower presentation. We told them about the worm towers and what you had to do with the buckets. Then we went out to their vegie patch and showed them what to do and where to put the worm scraps in the towers. After that we went back into their class and did a worksheet with them. Year 6 were amazed that worms have 5 hearts. They all loved the jelly worms that we made in class. Isabelle and Zoe A.
