Students cooked and prepared their lunch using local bush foods such as Yellowbelly & chips, salt bush chips, kangaroo mince spring rolls, emu egg omelette & wattle seed ice-cream for dessert. Uncle Mick told lots of stories about living down at the Sandhills and our girls were lucky enough to find a witchetty grub down near the wool scours but weren't brave enough to try it. Students remade Uncle Micks Gunya using bark, logs and leaves and then enjoyed the shade it provided on the hot day down at the Sandhills.

We would like to thank Uncle Mick for sharing his knowledge with our whole school throughout the year and especially our Yr 6 students leaving us at the end of the year.
